## From Dr. McEntire

*In him was life . . . John 1:4*

Renowned Physicist Stephen Hawking died recently. In an interview in 2010 he said, "I regard the brain as a computer which will stop working when its components fail. There is no heaven or afterlife for broken down computers; that is a fairy story for people afraid of the dark." This man who was blessed with an incredible mind and who overcame extreme physical limitations to exercise his keen intellect missed what many children understand. There is something more than this life!

Even if I did not have a Bible to reveal the truth of a life beyond our existence here, I would be prone to believe it. The grandeur of creation and the intricate web of life that demands pre-design and constant oversight in order for any of it to work unmistakably points to a Creator and Divine Mind. To believe that the world in which we see is the result of blind forces of time and chance defy logic. And if there is a Creator whose majestic handiwork is imprinted in every corner of His work, then it is reasonable to believe that He is some kind of powerful. And if He is that powerful, it doesn't reason that the one who created such a masterpiece would in turn not have the power to prevent it all from devolving into dust (or allow the computer to just stop running).

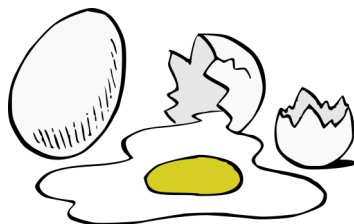
