BUT LET YOUR 'YES' BE 'YES,' AND YOUR 'NO,' 'NO.' MATTHEW 5:37

But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' Matthew 5:37

The faculty of HCS has benefitted from an approach to discipline called "Love and Logic." The materials are presented through books and seminars to both educators and parents. Here is the "Reader's Digest" version of the approach from Dr. Charles Faye. It is a good one.

Demonstrate unconditional warmth and love.

Kids feel this magical type of love when their parents spend plenty of time with them, when their parents focus on their strengths, and when their parents display empathy instead of anger or sarcasm when things go wrong.

2. Let your "yes" mean "yes" and your "no" always mean "no."

Great parents are extremely careful to set only the limits they know they can enforce. They remember this important rule for setting limits: Never tell a stubborn child what to do. Instead, describe what you will do or allow.

3. Allow your kids to experience the logical and natural consequences of their decisions.

Isn't it hard to watch our kids struggle with the consequences of their mistakes? While it breaks our hearts at times, allowing them to learn in this way gives them a tremendous advantage as they grow. They develop respect, responsibility, and a good grasp of good old- fashioned common sense. The key, of course, is to display empathy rather than anger.

Raising great kids really can be a joy when we remember that we don't have to overcomplicate things with too many skills and too much theory. Keep it simple and enjoy your kids.

Registration 2018/2019

The registration fee (for 1st grade and above) is now \$375. A reenrollment email was sent from Hamilton Christian via RenWeb. You will use your existing parent's web login at renweb.com to reenroll. The district code is HCA-LA. You must submit your packet, pay the HCS registration fee and the RenWeb enrollment fee for your student to be enrolled for this coming Fall. Re-enrollment

Students who have enrolled for next year, even though they already have a FACTS account set up, have to **set up a new agreement** for next year for the tuition to be drafted. Many of you have bypassed that part of the enrollment packet. The finance department cannot add any transactions to be **drafted starting in June** until a new payment plan is set up.

If the decision has been made for your student NOT to return to Hamilton next year, there is a place on the RenWeb re-enrollment page to indicate this.
