Come to Chapel

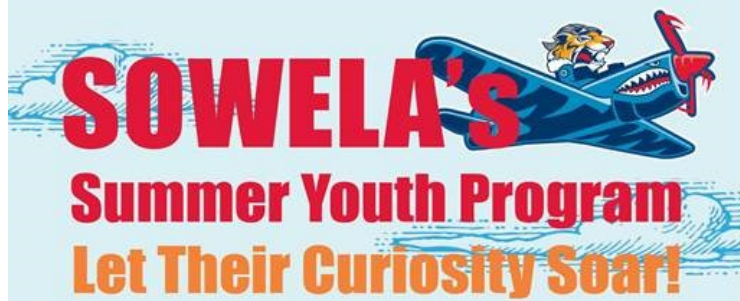
High School - Thursdays from 10:30 - 11:10 am

- Experience college life through a SOWELA campus tour and introductions to business faculty.

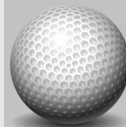

Re-enrollment

Students who have enrolled for next year, even though they already have a FACTS account set up, have to **set up a new agreement** for next year for the tuition to be drafted. Many of you have bypassed that part of the enrollment packet. The finance department cannot add any transactions to be **drafted starting in June** until a new payment plan is set up.

If the decision has been made for your student NOT to return to Hamilton next year, there is a place on the RenWeb re-enrollment page to indicate this.

Registration 2018/2019

The registration fee (for 1st grade and above) is now \$375. A reenrollment email was sent from Hamilton Christian via RenWeb. You will use your existing parent's web login at renweb.com to reenroll. The district code is HCA-LA. You must submit your packet, pay the HCS registration fee and the RenWeb enrollment fee for your student to be enrolled for this coming Fall.
