Author Rick Renner reminds us of how difficult it is to do family right in these last days:

The traditional family relationships that once existed in abundance are threatened today by schedules, multiple jobs in one home, financial pressure, divorce, kids living with separate parents, multiple cars that help to create separate paths of each family member's life, multiple televisions per home, and so on. Parents go one direction, while children go another direction – and very often even Dad and Mom don't go the same direction. Re-enrollment

Students who have enrolled for next year, even though they already have a FACTS account set up, have to **set up a new agreement** for next year for the tuition to be drafted. Many of you have bypassed that part of the enrollment packet. The finance department cannot add any transactions to be **drafted starting in June** until a new payment plan is set up.

If the decision has been made for your student NOT to return to Hamilton next year, there is a place on the RenWeb re-enrollment page to indicate this.

Admissions 2018/2019

There is a **five (5) percent discount on tuition if full payment** for the 2018/2019 school year is made **by May 24, 2018.**

New families that **complete enrollment by May 31** receive **\$200 off of tuition** (to be credited in Nov).

Current Hamilton families that **refer a new family** receive a **\$200 credit on tuition** as a thank you for that completed enrollment! In addition, the new family will receive a \$200 credit as well!! (All credits will be given in November.)
